Need:

42% of children are in poverty in Sneinton, our target area

Economic

£22m is being cut from the budget of schools in Nottingham

Environmental

7m of the 10m tonnes of food wasted every year in the UK is still edible

Business Model:

Inbound Logistics



Food is collected by our trained volunteers from local partners



Deliver up to 120 crates of food that would otherwise be wasted

Operations



Crates are processed and quality assurance checks are carried out by volunteers

Outbound Logistics



Surplus food is priced at 70% off retail price and sold in our shop



Crates of food are redistributed to our local partners (food banks, etc.)

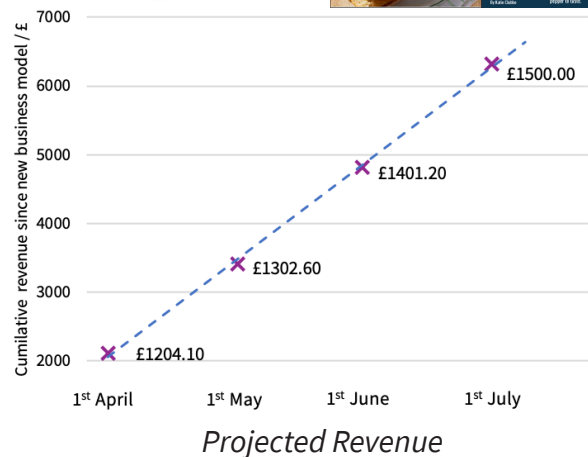
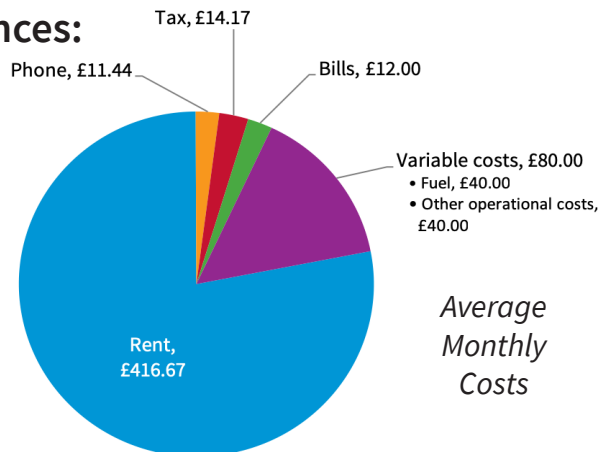


We offer free recipe cards in our Foodprint shop to encourage customers to make nutritious meals
